Original Brief

Building a **full stack website application** requires a lot of thought and planning. This case study outlines the project specifics, such as visual design and UX, information architecture, and the technical functionality.

This task was an open brief to **choose a subject matter** and client concept for your app, on the condition the idea and client **meet the following requirements**:

- App provide a useful interactive service to its users
- App must provide two levels of user access
- App must incorporate stunning visuals, imagery and aesthetics resulting in a memorable user experience
- App must require login access, that is to say nobody can access your app without already having an account

The chosen subject matter that was decided upon was an 'Animal Adoption Website', with the client mimicking RSCPA and Pet Rescue.

Project Goals

- To encourage people to adopt a pet from a shelter over purchasing one from a store
- · Educate people on the benefits of adoption over purchase
- To give healthy, well-behaved animals a loving and caring home (and get strays off the street)
- · To make space for new animals by adopting
- · To match the adopter with the right fit pet
- · Get people to donate money to shelters

Background Research


Animal shelters are home healthy, well-behaved animals waiting for a home. Adoption can be a life-changing experience for both the person and the pet; every animal deserves a loving family.

"In 2019, over 75% of dogs were re-homed or reclaimed from the RSPCA and over 65% of cats were as well." (Pets in Peace, 2021, para. 1) So, what are the **benefits of adopting a pet**? By adopting a pet from an animal shelter or rescue group...

- You'll help save the lives of two animals—the pet you adopt and a homeless animal that can be rescued because of space you make available.
- The number of euthanized animals could be reduced greatly if more people adopted pets instead of buying
- You'll most likely receive a pet with vetting already completed (spayed/neutered, vaccinated, micro chipped)

- You will have a choice of purebred animals or a mixed breed
- You can choose a pet of any age (some already potty trained)
- You'll receive constant support from the shelter when needed.

Client Research

'Meow' is a **fictional client**. Meow is an adoption shelter wishing to have an online presence. 'Meows' main goal is to give animals that are placed in a shelter a **second chance** with another family. Meow also gets stray animals off the streets, and gives them the necessary care they will need before going to a new home. The website will not only **showcases pets up for adoption** in Australia, as well as **provide information** needed after the pet has been adopted, to answer common questions, grooming information, vet information and much more!

Meow likes the RSPCA Adopt a Pet (https://www.adoptapet.com.

au) website and asks for theirs to be similar. "RSPCA Australia works to influence animal welfare policy, practice, and legislation across the country, through various avenues..." (RSPCA. 2022, para.1)

Part of their role is...

- Caring for animals- re homing neglected and unwanted animals through shelters by educating the community about responsible pet ownership.
- Enforcing the law- RSPCA works hard every day to prevent cruelty to animals, through enforcing animal welfare legislation.
- Farm animal welfare- ending the suffering of millions of layer hens in battery cages and ending the long-haul live export of sheep from Australia to the Middle East

Animal welfare science- putting a stop to testing on animals

User Research

"Australia has one of the highest pet ownership rates in the world according to the RSPCA, with over 29 million pets across households in Australia." (Pets in Peace. 2021, para 1)

- · 60% of pet owners have a dog
- 60% of Aussies view their pets as members of the family and enjoy their companionship

Target Audience:

- · Young Adults (20-30) who are getting their first pet
- · Families (with children) getting a family pet
- The Elderly (60+) getting a pet entering retirement
- · Single people looking for company
- · People who don't travel
- · People who maybe work part time or from home
- People with a disability (seeing eye-dogs)

User Goals:

- · To adopt a healthy, well-behaved pet
- See important information about the pet (age, vaccination status, behavioral characteristics etc.)
- To learn about the process of adopting a pet before adopting one
- To explore options, such as type as animal as well as breeds, age, location and any specifics before making a decision
- To receive support or information after an animal has been adopted


Sitemap Diagram



Information Architecture Layout (navigation bar)


























Information Architecture Layout (homepage)










